

We haven’t seen cars for 24 hours; because the bridge is out no one was allowed through.”

We also would like to mention a need that the orphanage has at this time of a smaller, more economical van to transport the boys to school each day and activities during the weekend. The bus we presently use is aging and is not very fuel efficient especially when the load is lighter. We have been praying about what we should do in this regard and have come to the conclusion that purchasing a smaller van would meet the majority of the needs while at the same time saving in gas costs. The cost is approximately \$25,000 for a 12-passenger van or \$26,000 for a 15-passenger van. We will be looking into the best deal that we can find that will meet the needs of the orphanage. If the Lord puts it on your heart to give to this project, just earmark that donation for "Nepo van."

We hope and pray that the new year brings more of Jesus's love into our homes and that we take that love into the world.

# Ghana

Thanks for your prayers. The president (President John Atta Mills of Ghana died unexpectedly in July) has been laid to rest after three days of well planned burial arrangement. Leadership transition was very smooth and beautiful. The vice has assumed the presidency, whilst the governor of the central bank has been put in his place. Thanks to God life is normal and we are looking forward to a peaceful election in December.

We would like to summarize the activities of churches outside Accra:

## *Nsawam*

You may be aware that the church in Nsawam had been inactive for some time now. Over the past few months there has been a consistent program of evangelism activities by the junior preachers using the mission bus, and this has brought the otherwise inactive church back to life. The present situation indicates that we need to repair the crack in the building, re-roof, and replace the old worn out and broken wooden chairs with about a hundred single plastic chairs. Work on the roof is now underway.

## *MamiKrobo*

The church at MamiKrobo in the Afram plains is steadily growing, with their numerical strength reaching over 100 by the end of the first half of the year. They have been able to put up a worship structure and are needing about 10 packets of iron roofing sheets.

## *AkimOda*

Work on the AkimOda structure has stalled and has not gone beyond the construction of the pillars. The next phase of the work will have to do with block work and roofing.

## *Akosoaso*

There is so much revival and inspiration in the church because of the periodic but constant visits to them. Contrary to expectation, their activities have in no way been affected by the absence of their head pastor, and their new pastor is doing very well. What we are faced with at the moment is that we are trying to relocate and resettle the head pastor's wife in her original hometown of Koforidua in the Eastern Region as requested by her family. To this end, we have procured a land on which we intend to put up a modest but decent dwelling place to resettle her.

## *Ekye*

One of our newest churches is in the Afram Plains beyond the river Volta within a community known as Ekye. A month ago about 27 souls were baptized. We have managed to acquire our own land and have started developing. Presently the construction is at the foundation level.



## **REVIVAL PROGRAMS IN ACCRA**

There had been two successful revival programs within the past three months. The first program which took place on June 30, at Mataheko, was the Women's Revival themed "The Woman of Excellence".

The second one was the Youth Revival service that took place on August 11 under the theme, "The outpouring of the Spirit". The purpose of these programs was to target the different age classes of the church for spiritual empowerment and personal growth, and re-direct them towards God's original gospel plan for the individual and the church. Both services started at 5:30am and closed at around 8:00am. Pastor John Clotney was in charge.

The program for the men will take place sometime in October.

## **BAPTISMS**

Within the past couple of months we have performed baptism in the following churches: Ekye, 27 souls, Awoshie, 45 souls, Lashibi, 15 souls, and Tema, 36 souls, and 3 more are waiting to be baptized.

## **SCHOOL**

Activities at the school covers the period of April through July, 2012. The teaching and the non-teaching staff have all been registered with the Social Security and National insurance Trust, and have all been issued with registration cards.

The school has formed four clubs (obligatory to all schools under the Ghana Education Service) namely: The Cadet Club, The Choir, The Scripture Union and the Cultural Troupe. The Choir and the Cadet Group are already actively functioning, while the other two will be in action when school re-opens in early September.

The Faith Evangelical Complex School was engaged in two major soccer encounters of which we were victorious. The Faith Evangelical Complex School has also been an active member of the Ghana National Association of Private Schools, and for that reason the head-teacher of the school, Mr. Augustus Lamptey, has been appointed as the Assistant secretary of our Zone.



Payment of school fees effectively has been a problem over the years, though there has been an improvement this term. It is our hope that we

are getting to a point where this will be a problem of the past. As for the school building we are waiting for the Funds to complete the upper two floors.

### **FAITH EVANGELICAL MISSION CLINIC GENEARL REPORT**

We have just begun another year and we are so grateful to the Almighty for all the blessings we enjoyed from Him. This year has shown signs of challenges already as we see government policies on health being attacked from various angles, politically and socially. Nevertheless, we are hopefully looking to the grace of God on us to serve the citizenry better.

There has been a systematic increase in this year's patient attendance as compared to previous years. Attendance statistics have been provided, and there has been an increase in the number of patients served month to month over last year.

Medical support is provided for members of the Mission Church, people of the catchment area of the hospital, or accident patients or the poor who are treated freely.

Though we recorded an increase in delivery cases, we are not satisfied because our operating theatre is not well equipped for caesarean sections and other emergencies. In the Obstetrics and Gynecological department, we have seen increase in numbers from 804 patients in the first half of 2011 to 902 patients in the first half of 2012. We must therefore believe God to improve this Obstetrics and gynecological department.

For instance the obstetrician has requested an ADJUSTABLE (all purpose bed) DELIVERY BED to facilitate the total time spent on each patient. We have also seen a drop in the number of patients who have received Ultrasound scans. The sharp drop is due to challenges we encountered

: one, the radiologist we were using earlier left; she was replaced by one who was not a radiologist, and who made patients travel far for results which was so disturbing that most patients went away to a different hospital.



The Optometrist Dr. Okyere, has requested the following items for the Eye Clinic: a Tonometer, a visual acuity chart, an Automaticrefractometer, an Ophthalmoscope, a Retinoscope, and a Pen Light. The Eye Clinic saw a total of 246 patients during the first half of the year. The E.N.T. Department is also growing and has had a total of 312 patients. The PHYSICIAN specialist section also saw a total of 119 patients.

We have had major challenges with our drugs acquisition due to financial difficulties. We have to say a big thank you to ACTION MEDEOR (this is done through the work of the Hilfe in Germany and Switzerland – the equivalent of our Foundation) who has bailed us out so much this year by sending us more than 14,000.00 Euros worth of drugs. We are not the only entity facing this problem but the public and private sectors too.

In the Surgery department we are trusting God to help us refurbish and reequip to the fullest. As we have been finally accredited we still lack a few things to move into full operations. By the grace of God we were able to carry out our first major surgery this year after renting a patient monitor, and a stand-by power generator, etc. In fact the whole hospital staff was thrown into a frenzy of joy, because we were able to complete surgeries.

### **CONCLUSION**

In conclusion, we say a big big thank you to God for the mission hospital to be filled each and every day with patients due to His healing mercies in our facility and where patients testify of the Kings healing touch in our daily Morning Devotions .

It is still worth noting and knowing to the praise of our Most High God that the influx of patients to our Mission Hospital is due to:

1. The quality of our drugs from Action Medeor ,
2. We give more drugs, care and attention to patients,
3. The low prices of NHIS Drug Tariff makes other facilities shy away from giving their best to avoid folding up, even

including the government facilities,

4. The free medical support to both our Church members, Ministers and mostly nonChurch members.

We are so grateful to God and those who have availed themselves as vessels in the Master's hand.

Some of our recent activities...The 9th graders just came home from a two day fieldtrip visiting one of the two hydroelectric dams in Paraguay, a factory, and the city of Encarnacion. The green team won in our annual school Olympics and in the opening ceremony we celebrated our 10 years! Each team prepared choreographies, special numbers, a skit, Bible and academic challenge games, as well as the sports activities. We brought home 5 trophies in the ACSI (Association of Christian Schools International) Olympics. We had a pizza party on Youth Day. The kindergarteners had a wonderful presentation of Noah's Ark.

As we finish up one year we are already preparing for another. Some teachers will move on, but most of them will stay with us. We are already praying for the new group of teachers and students that will be with us next year.

Please remember that many of our students (70) are with us because YOU have provided for their scholarship. We need only \$1000 a year to sponsor a student...or \$100 a month. These families are depending on God for the



education of their children and are grateful for your donations. We also need funds for painting and construction at the end of every year. Any other donation would go towards salaries, insurance and other costs.

# Argentina

## MOCOVI, ARGENTINA

I know you are very busy people and that is why I will try to be brief with news and prayer requests.

As a family we have gone through some difficulties during the last three months. We experienced a chimney fire in our house. Although the damage was significant, thank God we were home and were able to extinguish the fire. We immediately called the fire department but they arrived a half hour later.

Two months ago Stella suffered a broken metatarsal of her right foot, had to walk in a cast for three weeks and with an orthopedic boot for another three weeks. Now she is doing rehab every day and walks with a cane.

On September 10 I had an angioplasty placing a stent in one artery. It was successful, thank the Lord. I did not feel badly before the procedure but now I am much better. When I was hospitalized I started having symptoms of inflammation of the prostate which I suffer from time to time. This time it was much more serious. Finally it was determined that I will have surgery on October 5 to remove it.



A family from Guatemala with two children were prepared to come to work in the mission among the Mocovi people, natives in northern Argentina; however, last week

the husband, Williams age 28, was gunned down by drug traffickers, dying instantly. Five years ago Williams became a Christian and left the drug traffickers but they did not forget him. I ask your prayers for his wife, Angelica age 28 and her two children Erikson and Debora. They still plan to move to the mission where they were called as a family to serve. Let us pray that the death of Williams will impact the community and be a blessing to many.

This week a worker returned from a 10 day trip to Cuba and brought very good news. We plan to send a missionary there in December.

In spite of the circumstances, we are experiencing a time of growth in our lives and ministry.

Also please pray for brother Ernesto and sister Marta who regularly travel to the nearby churches in Uriburu, El Colorado and Pirane to visit and assist the workers there.

In our last Newsletter article, we expressed our desire to raise up a group of 350 supporters who could commit to supporting the ministry of CLM through prayer and with a financial contribution of \$50 per month. We are calling this program the 50/350 program, and these partners are our 50/350 partners. Our desire is to establish a financial support base that will sustain the basic operation of the ministry each month so we can meet our financial commitments and thus honor God in our finances.

After we began to launch this program, there were requests for a ministry plan that would explain where these donations are going and how they are being used. We are intending to present this ministry plan to you in several parts. It will include a look at what has already been accomplished, a look at goals for the future, an itemized budget, and mission/vision statements. We want to help everyone who is supporting CLM, or has done so in the past, to understand the direction we believe God is taking us.

This month starts by looking back at what God has so graciously allowed us to accomplish over the past year through the hard work and dedication of the members of our team and local and overseas volunteers, applying the wisdom and financial resources that our Heavenly Father has provided. He used ministry partners like you to help us to accomplish this mission, and we ask you to celebrate with us the myriad ways God has provided for positive changes to take place in the past year.

At the Entre Rios facility, many changes were made to enable us to more effectively minister to the children in our care. First, we moved all the older boys and girls (approximately 13 and up) to separate houses, where each group lives with an individual caretaker. This provided for an environment more similar to a traditional family, where fewer people live in one house, and there is increased opportunity for each caretaker has to teach life skills in the context of daily living.

The building that formerly housed the woodworking shop and mechanics shop was changed into an education building, to provide a centralized area for activities and increased safety and security for the children. The woodworking and mechanics shops were moved to the barn to create a specific area for maintenance and projects farther from the area where the younger children circulate. One of the smaller houses was changed into an administrative building, allowing sufficient work space for the administrative personnel now required by Brazilian law.

Significant maintenance issues in the main house were resolved, including fixing a faulty septic system and painting the interior of the house. Through a special fundraising initiative organized by a short-termer who spent time here, we were able to install a deep well, resolving problems with water quality and continual pump problems.

Some specific changes also occurred on the farm. Part of the barn roof was rebuilt in order to adequately shelter the animals we raise for meat. Wheat was planted as a winter crop for the first time, and the income was used to help fund the renovations. A local business approached us with a proposal to use part of our land for a research project involving eucalyptus trees. The proposal is for the project to benefit CLM by bringing 100 percent pay back in five years, and it should continue to bring additional income for fifteen years.

The Brazilian government allows taxpayers to designate a portion of their income tax to a qualifying charity of their choice. This money can be used by the charity for specific purposes. One of those purposes is purchasing new vehicles. Using these income tax funds, we were able to begin replacing our older vehicles with new ones, dramatically reducing the amount of time and money we have to spend maintaining and repairing aging vehicles. Newer vehicles maintain their value better here than in the U.S., so there can actually be a significant savings from being more intentional in replacing older vehicles.

We rejoice in the Lord's provision for all these changes that have already been accomplished, and we look forward to what He will do here in the future!

This coming year we plan to complete the transition to a house parent system in which all of the children will live with caretakers in smaller houses or apartments. This may take some time, as renovations will be necessary to provide these smaller living spaces in a way that is in compliance with all laws regarding institutional child care in Brazil. Additional changes also need to be made in the main building, such as painting the exterior and remodeling the kitchen to meet new health department requirements. We are also studying the possibility of installing cameras in the



main building to increase security for the children and workers.

Some specific cost-cutting measures are in the works, as well. We are looking into methods of reducing electrical costs by installing solar water heating and checking our eligibility for additional discounts from the electric company. We are also planning to continue with the vehicle exchange program we started last year. This plan trades one vehicle per year and eventually will result in no vehicle being more than six years old. As I said above, this program is made possible through the income tax grants for which we are eligible each year.

We thank the Lord for His provision and we trust Him for continued guidance during this time of many transitions. Thank you for your continued prayers on our behalf, as well as your faithful support through donations. We especially ask for your prayers for the establishment of our 50/350 team. We depend on your partnership in this ministry! Trusting the Lord,

# Redemption Ranch

A few years ago, the Lord placed on our hearts the desire to start a unique equine-facilitated mentoring and outreach program for at-risk and disadvantaged children, youth and families, where horses and humans can meet and find hope and healing together. Just over a year ago now (in August 2011), after much praying and searching for properties, God provided a little 5-acre property in Amherstburg, Ontario, and Redemption Ranch was born.

The mission of our non-profit organization is four-fold (Rescue, Serve, Mentor, Equip): to rescue and rehabilitate unwanted, sick, abused, and neglected horses; to provide inspiration and opportunities for personal involvement and impact in community service; to encourage and build trust, respect, character, and life skills through one-on-one relationships; to conduct evangelistic and discipleship meetings, workshops and events associated with the Christian faith.

Horses were created by God with a special ability to sense or feel a person's heart and it's amazing to see a horse connect with someone who is emotionally, physically, sexually or mentally wounded or struggling. Our program is not about teaching people to become professional riders - it is about letting them share in the care and friendship of a horse. It's about embarking on a journey of learning and self-discovery, fun and friendship, growth and responsibility, confidence and character-building, hope and redemption.

We've been blessed to witness our four horses, three of which have come from various rescue situations of neglect, starvation, abuse and abandonment, make a dramatic impact in the lives of individual kids who have visited the Ranch, and in workshops with foster children through the Children's Aid Society. This ministry has also created incredible opportunities for our local churches in Windsor

and Beverly Hills, as well as the ICFG to get involved in domestic mission work teams. In October of last year and again this year, the



ICFG organized a work team weekend where over 50 youth and adults from across North America came together for fun, fellowship and hard work. They helped transform our


simple country property into a place of refuge, healing and tranquility.

Currently, we are partnering with the Children's Aid Society to provide backpacks filled with winter gear and school supplies for needy children in the community. They have also asked us to provide weekly mentoring sessions with their special needs small groups. In addition, we are developing a proposal for the public school system to offer field trips to various schools within the area.

We have been so blessed throughout this journey as God has showed Himself faithful time and again in providing for every need and aspect of His ministry. We want to express our deep appreciation to everyone who has participated, prayed, and provided for this ministry with your time, talents and treasures – you hold a special place in our hearts here at Redemption Ranch.
