**TOPIC:** GIVING TO GOD

**INTRODUCTION:**

“Giving to God” what does it actually mean? Frequently we hear it referred to as giving money. In reality “Giving to God” means giving our all to Him so that He can do with it as He pleases. It means laying our very life, hopes, desires, ambitions, and material things at His feet. Can we with Isaiah say, *“Here am I, send me”*? Even as Elijah, Jonah, the disciples, Paul and others gave Him their lives, of which He could make useful vessels, we too must give ours if we wish to give to God.

The fruit developed within us by the Holy Spirit must also be given. If we give our worldly wealth but withhold our love, it *“profiteth us nothing.”* But Jesus said if we forsake all and give ourselves to Him, our reward would be thirty, sixty, or maybe a hundred fold.

We should give our time, talents, and money at His disposal and surrender so completely that we can understand what He wishes us to do with them. He can through us put them to use. This puts all responsibility upon Him and in this way we are not subject to errors and failures. He will do with us what is best in His sight.

**CENTRAL TRUTH:** We are under the highest obligation to use our money, time and talents to the glory of God as He directs.

**GOLDEN TEXT:** *HE WHICH SOWETH SPARINGLY SHALL REAP ALSO SPARINGLY: AND HE WHICH SOWETH BOUNTIFULLY SHALL REAP ALSO BOUNTIFULLY.*  
2 Corinthians 9:6

In the Old Covenant Law of Moses, the Israelites were expected to bring a specified portion of the support of temple worship. Besides this, God added His blessing to anything that they freely offered for their needed fellowmen. *“Cast thy bread upon the waters, for thou shalt find it after many days.”* (Ecclesiastes 11:1)

In the New Covenant day of grace it is much the same, yet with this difference. Because of the love of Christ in our hearts, we should always be ready to share with others the gifts God has bestowed upon us. When Paul writes of reaping according to our sowing, he does not primarily refer to material gains. The greatest blessing that we can reap is to know that through our gifts we are helping to extend the grace and love of God and in so doing that same grace and love of God is multiplied to us. *“And by their prayer for you, which long after you for the exceeding grace of God in you.”* (2 Corinthians 9:14)
