

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION

1. In what way did Jesus make known His authority over man?
2. In what ways does Jesus still have authority over man yet today?
3. What lesson can we learn for our lives in the evidence of Jesus' authority over demons and sickness?
4. If demons know Christ and submit to His authority, why is it so difficult for the world to recognize Him?

QUARTERLY THEME: Christ - King and Savior

TOPIC: JESUS’ MINISTRY IN GALILEE

INTRODUCTION:

Even Jesus found strength in seeking a quiet place—alone with the Father. He rose up early, long before daylight, and went alone out to a solitary place to pray.

Jesus’ life was focused on His purpose. He had come to call sinners to repentance, and to give His life a ransom for mankind. (Mark 2:17; 10:45) Jesus **knew** His purpose and He fully completed it. Why are **we** here?

Jesus already had a following. People flocked to hear Him. But He left His present location to go into the next towns to preach “*for therefore came I forth.*” Does a “church activity” keep us in one spot when perhaps He would have us go forth into the next towns, or into the uttermost regions?

Jesus’ ministry began with prayer, and it was marked by compassion and by power. He was willing—and able—to deliver mankind. He is today still willing and able to deliver and to cleanse!

CENTRAL TRUTH: If we trust Him, Christ will supply both spiritual and temporal needs.

GOLDEN TEXT: . . . ***IF THOU WILT, THOU CANST MAKE ME CLEAN.***

Mark 1:40b

“If Thou wilt, Thou canst ...” **nothing** is impossible with God. There is only the question of **His will**, and the question of **our faith**. (Mark 9:36-37; 2 Corinthians 12:7-9)

Some of our “wants” may not be within His divine will . . . and for these “our faith is weak.” God gives His best to those who leave the choice with Him.

But God’s Word is clear. It is His will that **all** repent and be saved. (1 Timothy 2:4; 2 Peter 3:9) No exceptions! It is His Will that YOU repent and be saved. It is His will that the heathen in the uttermost parts hear, repent, and be saved. (Luke 24:47)

“Thou canst, ...” He is also able ... “*to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by Him ...*” (Hebrews 7:25). No exceptions! “*Whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.*” (Romans 10:13) He is willing, and He is able!
