1. How are these men to be our example under these circumstances?

3. When do you feel closest to God?
4. Did the Apostles have the Holy Spirit before Pentecost?
(John 20:22, Acts 1:8)

SUMMARY:

The apostles and others were in Jerusalem waiting to receive the Holy Spirit that Christ promised He would send to them. There was some unfinished work that had to be done concerning Judas (vs. 16) who had been a part of them.

Until the faithful apostles severed themselves completely with any connection with Judas and filled his office with another faithful apostle, they were not ready to receive the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. So, with us also, if sin is present in our hearts and lives, we cannot expect Christ's Spirit to dwell there. [SoF:9] Preparation of the heart and mind is a prerequisite to every spiritual blessing.

NOTES:

[SoF:9] We believe in the baptism of the Holy Spirit, by Whose indwelling the believer is empowered to live a Godly life in spiritual unity with Christ.

PREPARATIONS FOR PENTECOST

LESSON TEXT: *Acts 1:12-26*

LESSON SETTING: The apostles and followers returned from the Mt. of Olives to Jerusalem to the upper room where the apostles lived.

TIME: Approximately 33 A.D. - just after Christ's ascension.

QUARTERLY THEME: The Early Church

TOPIC: THE COMING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

INTRODUCTION:

In the time of the Old Testament, God's Spirit was present among His people. He often spoke audibly to the people or sent angels to deliver His messages. He spoke in the form of clouds and fire. Today He does not do so, as it certainly is not necessary. He has given us something far more wonderful, His Spirit which in all certainty, is a Holy person living within our very being.

He speaks to us telling us of God's Will, glorifying Christ within us, leading us as we should be led. He first was given to mankind, after Christ's resurrection and received of the disciples as they waited for Him. He came in the form of tongues of fire and was present within every true disciple of Christ. What a thrill of amazement must have been theirs when they knew the Holy Spirit was present within each heart.

CENTRAL TRUTH: The Holy Spirit comes to make believers more effective in their witness.

GOLDEN TEXT: *AND IT SHALL COME TO PASS IN THE LAST DAYS, SAITH GOD, I WILL POUR OUT OF MY SPIRIT UPON ALL FLESH.*
Acts 2:17

How great is God, and how unsearchable is His love for mankind! In spite of man's sin and disobedience, God longed for man to be restored. During the dispensation of the law, God the Creator was always near to those who sincerely sought Him. When all else failed because of man's fallen nature and inability to do the good, God, the Son, came to this earth to reveal His good will toward men. "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by His Son." (Hebrews 1:1-2)

Now, in the time of the apostles, God, the Holy Spirit, was prepared to come into prepared hearts. This truly was the beginning of the last days, when the Spirit would come unto all who sought God in His fullness. God through the law makes man realize the need of God, the Savior. Jesus, in finishing the work of redemption, promised to send God the Spirit to His followers, for whom He, at God's right hand, intercedes. "How shall we escape if we neglect so great salvation?" (Hebrews 2:3)
