(Ghana)

By the grace of God, donations were received here in Accra from the Apostolic Christian Church Nazarean in early June 2019. The amount was used to support projects in the Manponse Church, the School Complex, the Clinic and arrangements for the proposed hospital at Anyaa. Thanks be to the name of the Lord.

MANPONSE CHURCH: Repair on the windows and structure is on-going. The church will definitely require more support to bring the repair work to conclusion.

TEMA CHURCH: Work is still ongoing.

SAAMAN CHURCH: The construction work on the new church building has started. We thank the Lord for the progress being made.

KORLE GONNO CHURCH: work on the church building is ongoing.

PASTORS' PRAYER DAY: In the month of June, all Pastors were to attend a prayer meeting every Thursday. At each meeting, prayers were offered for the Mission, ACCN, ACCMBC, the nation, and world peace.

PASTORS' WIVES ASSOCIATION: This Association was inaugurated in July for the education and well-being of the wives of Pastors. A conference, with the theme, "ROLE OF A PASTOR'S WIFE", was held at the

inauguration. The occasion was well attended and we pray the grace of the Lord upon this Association. We deeply appreciate what the Lord is doing with our women's movement.

FIRST YEAR CELEBRATION OF THE KAIROS GROUP: The 28th of July was the first anniversary of the Kairos Group, and the occasion was marked by a worship service at the Cathedral at Mataheko. The group was formed a year ago to give the Youth of the Mission an opportunity to hold a worship service every

month. Their services are completely handled by their members as a means of unearthing those with special talents. The first anniversary celebration was dynamic. Glory be to God.

THE HOSPITAL: The Dental Clinic is having serious problems with their dental chair. Plans are underway to replace the old chair. A team of doctors, nurses, laboratory technicians, dental nurses, a dentist and an ophthalmologist

went on an outreach to Akim Suabe, in the Eastern Region, for three days, to undertake health screening of the residents. Screenings were done for malaria, hepatitis B, dental, blood sugar and child welfare. After the visit, the Chief of the town offered the hospital a building to be used as a clinic, and land for the building of a church.

THE SCHOOL COMPLEX: The School Complex had graduation ceremonies for pupils completing Kindergarten, Primary school and Junior High school this year. The school is now on vacation and will re-open in September, 2019. The School Complex received two payments

from the Apostolic Christian Mission Board of Canada for scholarships offered to some students of the School complex. Thanks be to God.

Greetings from Green Olive Tree Ministries in Gravata, Pernambuco, Brazil

We feel as though we should reintroduce ourselves, after a very long absence from these pages!

Never having been overly prolific with State of the Mission Releases, we actually went speechless over the past many years as we were caught up in a turmoil of events, both personally and as a mission, that rendered words

elusive and/or inadequate, as our thoughts and minds scrambled to keep up and keep on. A calm has come to our storm recently, and with it a reminder of that faithful medium of communication, the ACCF Newsletter.

GOTM was founded to be a voice, planted firmly in the house of the Lord, singing of His loving kindness, in the Northeast of Brazil. (Psalm 52:8) Our goal has been to display the Lord's glory by delighting in Him. Our mission has been to love the cast out ones, the homeless ones, the motherless ones, the ones without teaching. We have striven to reach the varying needs of those whom the Lord has brought to us by functioning as a home, a family, a school, a church, a refuge, sometimes a hospital, sometimes a rehab, sometimes a transitional holding place, sometimes just a single meal. It has been a place to give new life, and, at times, a safe place to die. As the ministry continues year after year, (we are now completing the 27th year of ministry in Pernambuco) its form is in constant motion, flowing from one job description to another, changing like a mobile in the wind, but always

held together by the translucent cord of God's unfailing love.



But, in our opinion, there is one constant. As many of the aspects of the ministry swell into prominence and in turn recede into obscurity, the Ministry of Family is always there.

We see in scripture two distinct expressions of family that model important truths. One is the sacredness of marriage, the union of husband and wife representing the relationship of Christ to the church. The second is adoption, showing our rescue from Satan's clutches and being firmly planted

as children of God the Father and co-heirs with Christ.

GOTM was called to model to a town, to a community, to a people,

What GOTM needs:

God's purpose- in the institution, Family. That includes displaying the sacred value of each person bearing the

image of the Creator, necessitating ours being a family willing to rescue children from death's clutches and plant them in a forever family.

In the passing of days, there have been many delightful moments which every mom and dad cling to and treasure. There have been long seasons of struggle, things we would like to forget. In the most recent years, the Lord has allowed the unleashing of a storm that has challenged to the core this idea of family, of ministry, at GOTM. Sickness, separation, betrayal, rebellion,

and temptation to give in and give up. The thread we grasped, in often aching or sweaty hands, at times felt slack and hardly there, and at others, so taut that it must surely break. It held. Today, He is wiping the mud from our eyes, the sky is clearing, and as we look around we see that His purpose, His calling on GOTM has not changed. There is still family to care for, teaching to tend to, places of healing to offer and God's loving kindnesses to sing about in a community that is still filled with lost and broken people.

As we, Brent and Debbie, age, and as the family and its needs are being spread out over both North and South America, yet another dimension to this changing mobile must be considered. Therefore a rough draft called "The Three Year Plan", culminating on Brent's 70th birthday and

45 years of family, has been conceived. The plan is gradual transitional steps. It's goals are;

- 1. To Physically reunite Brent and Debbie to live in the same country! (they have been apart for just short of 7 years, due to extenuating family needs)
- 2. To provide for the long term care of adult dependent family members who must remain in Brazil.
- 3. To provide for the long term care of dependent family members who must remain in the US.
- 4. To provide for ongoing leadership and structure for the continued outreach of GOTM in Pernambuco.

What GOTM needs:

- * Prayer to fill
- * Wisdom to act
- * Strength to endure
- * Workers to battle
- * Finances to grow

"For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped



praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of His will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please Him in every way; bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God, being strengthened with all power



according to His glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience, giving joyful thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of His holy people in the kingdom of light. For He has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son He loves, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. Colossians 1:9-14

Dear brothers and sisters,

The past three months have gone by very quickly and it's time to update you again on the things the Lord has been doing at CLM. We are grateful for your continual support in prayer and giving.

Changing Lives

In June, we celebrated the birthdays of two teens with very painful life stories. We would like to share part of what Mary Gibson wrote after the birthday party, illustrating the life stories that God is changing through CLM:

God has always put on my heart that a birthday party is a celebration, not just of one more year of life, but of the life itself, that God has placed in our care. God reminded me of that concept once again with the birthday party for Jorge* and Paula*. Jorge was a part of the CLM family as a very young child. He originally went to CLM Turvo with his brother, Luan*. From there they returned to their mother. That lasted a week, when Jorge was almost caught in a house fire caused by

a conflict their mother had with a neighbor. They were returned to CLM. They spent some time at CLM Entre Rios and then were returned to their father. That lasted a bit longer, until the father was sent to prison for getting a teenage girl pregnant. They were sent to the government group home, where they spent several years. Finally, they were returned to CLM over a year ago. Both brothers have made significant progress. Jorge presents with some

behavior problems, having moments of intense anger and lack of control. He returned to us on 10 controlled medications. Thankfully, that has been reduced to 4 and eventually, we hope that he can get off of them. With all of these ups and downs and traumas in Jorge's life, we praise God for how far he has progressed and just for who he is in all of his uniqueness. He is so special in God's eyes. ... Paula just came to CLM a couple of weeks ago. She, for sure, has one of the most horrible stories of any child that has come to CLM in the 38 years that I have been here. As we see so often, she is a case

that should have been removed from the family when she was 3 or 4 years old, if not before. In the first 12 years of her life she had been sexually abused by her father, beaten by her family for turning him in and "causing" him to go to prison, addicted to crack, sent to drug rehab several times, sexually active, declares to be a homosexual, and who knows what else. Paula is a beautiful girl, very agitated, but usually with a beautiful smile on her face. She has run away, once, so far. She has been difficult, but is slowly settling down. She is expressing her desire and dreams to get on board with her studies and is accepting help. She has caused problems at school but doesn't want to

continue to cause such problems. All of it is very difficult for her. We love her. Does she understand that or even understand what love is? Not yet. But every expression of genuine love we can show her helps plant the seed that will bring transformation. ... Will she continue to be difficult? For sure, as will Jorge, but we trust that God will always help us see them through His eyes and heart, and will continue to do His beautiful work of molding and transforming in each of them.

They were quickly put to work filling in gaps and taking care of kids whose caregivers were on medical leave. Shortly thereafter, they received their own group of 3 kids to take care of, plus 1-2 more when other



caregivers have a day off. Please pray for their adaptation and for God's special grace for them, as they adapt to the continually changing demands of life at CLM.

Travels

Anderson and Dani Kasnocha and their son, Joao Vicente, as well as their unborn son, were blessed with a trip to the United States. The purpose was to travel to Warm Beach and Eastern church camps and share about CLM. It was quite an experience with the difference in culture, language, food, and everything else. Besides the presentations at camps, they were invited to do several other presentations in individual churches. Their experiences were very positive. Of course, returning home is also a blessing, especially when there are rice and beans waiting for you!

Anderson wrote, "In July I had the opportunity to go, with my family, to Eastern Camp and Western Camp. It was a very intense 3 weeks, with a lot of learning, where we could show the work being done at CLM and also meet and thank the people who have supported this work, financially, and in their prayers. I thank God and everyone who made this moment possible."

Bethany and her two children were also in the United States. They attended Eastern Camp and were able to visit family in Ohio and New Jersey. Bethany was also invited to do some church presentations. Their trip back to Brazil was a little more adventurous. After having boarded for the long flight to Sao Paulo, they were removed from the plane due to mechanical problems. It was not determined until about 2:00 in the morning that the plane would not fly. They ended up leaving the next morning and arriving in Curitiba too late to get a bus to Guarapuava. They were able to spend the night at Robert and Alzira Lay's house and arrived home on Saturday afternoon. Their excitement was not to eat rice and beans, but to be reunited with their husband/father, Juan!

Winter Vacation

Not everyone traveled during vacation, but we had lots of fun moments during the 2 weeks the kids had off for winter break. Wal organized and

led a week-long team competition for the younger kids. There were the usual fun activities like pie in the face, tug of war, water balloons, etc.

The church had a children's evangelism event one Saturday afternoon. The theme was "Jesus is our Joy." It included clowns, presentations, singing, and other fun things. The message of the gospel was presented in many ways throughout the whole program. It was very well attended and a real blessing.

July 20th was International Friendship Day. Wal passed

out names to everyone and the idea was to pray for that person. On a Tuesday night, the secret friend was revealed and there was more prayer for each other. Along the same lines, on Sunday, the 21st, a group from LL Ambiental came to do activities with all. They taught us how to make recycled paper. They too exchanged names among everyone. The recycled paper was used to make cards for our secret pals. A tremendous

party was given afterwards.

We celebrated the July birthdays on July 13th. Deivid turned 9 on July 2nd, Edevilson turned 15 on July 8th, and

Please continue to keep the CLM kids and team in your prayers, as the daily struggles are many, and the enemy is actively trying to destroy the work God is doing in the lives of the children and missionaries. May God continue to bless each one of you, as you serve Him!



After a quick phone chat, flights were booked, arrangement emails were sent, and the adventure was set.

In terms of being prepared...my, we were in for quite the awakening. Our responsibilities, while as the orphanage, were handling the night duties and care of two newborn babies, as well as providing lunch and dinner for the entire crew, the days

that we were there. My mom and I knew we could be a blessing, as she is quite the cook, but we were not prepared for the profound blessings we would receive. As we flew into San Diego, one of the administrators, Natasha, picked us up, and kindly allowed us to stop and pick up all the things we needed to serve and provide for the group. Now, my mom is known for her cooking skills, and she was determined to spoil the group at the orphanage with her menu plans.

As we neared the orphanage, the dirt road (unlike any dirt road I have ever been on!), that let us to our destination, was the first moment of apprehension. What had we signed up for?

My mom and I were hosted by one of the strongest women I have ever met. Becca was taking care of two newborns, as well as two children under 5, and we were there to give her a much-needed break. We immediately began our duties, and it became evident that these caregivers stretch themselves to provide for every need of these children. As the days went by, we strove to



Each evening, we were able to sit as a group for dinner. All the kids were so gracious, even to the point of singing "Happy

Birthday" to my mom, as we celebrated her special day...complete with a Dulce de leche cake from the local bakery. The caregivers, Becca, Jonathan & Carla, were simply amazing. We were in awe of their patience and love towards these kids. They also did everything to make us feel comfortable in our environment, even taking us for a tour of the local town, having the best tacos of my life, and having a bonfire under the stars. We were able

to play with the kids and help them with everyday tasks... also getting them involved with some of the food preparations and making homemade play dough. Even through the language barrier, we were able to love them and make sure they knew how important they were to God, and us.



As we battled sickness,

exhaustion and one of two kitchen mishaps, our blessings were many and the Lord sustained us. We were able to fervently pray over these children... that they would know the love, grace and protection of Jesus. On our final day, as we prepared to leave, my mom and I were putting the babies down for a nap, after rocking them to sleep. As tears streamed down our faces, we were able to pray over them one last time... that they would always know they are so loved and important to our Heavenly Father.



My mom and I still keep in contact with the caregivers. We love hearing updates on the kids as they are reunited with their families, or find new loving homes. Our experience at Little Hands has been intentionally life changing. We learned to love others better, love each other better, and most importantly, love Jesus better. We wouldn't trade our busy days and sleepless nights for any other vacation that could have been planned. We are forever grateful that we followed God's calling to serve. We would like to encourage

others to do the same... mothers and daughters, couples, girl's trips, friends... We can assure, you there is so much that you have to offer. There is no greater joy than actively being the hands and feet of Jesus.

the Zacharias brothers (Diogo, Kauã, and Maycon), the Brogio brothers (Davi and Gabriel), and Vitor returning to their respective families and asked for your prayers for the Lord's will to be done in these situations. We thank you for your prayers and praise God for answering our requests. As of today, all of these boys are back with their families and adapting well. We thank God for bringing restoration and healing to these families and pray that the seeds that were planted in these boys' hearts during their time at the Nepo Children's Home will continue to take root and grow.

Due to the fact that our children are now with us for shorter periods of time (the government mandates that the length

of their stay cannot exceed 1.5 years), we attempt to take advantage of every opportunity to share with them about our Savior's love, and teach them His Word. One way that we do this is through morning



and evening devotions, led by the caretakers. Recently, we were able to purchase a variety of devotionals, age appropriate lessons, and hands-on resources from a Christian publishing company in São Paulo, to be used in these devotional times. We are grateful for financial support to be able to make purchases like this and praise God for His provision.

We would like to extend an invitation to anyone who would be interested in coming as a short-term missionary, to help teach English to our boys. We recently have welcomed several short-term missionaries from Canada, South Africa, Switzerland, Poland, and France through Operation Mobilization Brazil. These missionaries each stayed for about a month, and during their time, despite the language barrier, they were able to teach the boys English, play with them during free-time, and do special

We recently held an eight-day Vacation Bible School over the course of the boys' two-week winter break from school, and invited the neighborhood children to participate as well. The theme was 1 John 4:19, "We love because

He first loved us.", and all of the daily devotionals were based upon this verse. Along with a daily devotional, the children participated in a time of praise and worship, and every afternoon featured a different activity. Some of these activities included learning how to make bread, making and flying kites, drawing and design, painting, bingo, and various field games. And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground; neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the time in the field, saith the LORD of hosts. And all nations shall call you blessed: for ye shall be a delightsome land, saith the LORD of hosts. (Mal 3:10-12)

A tool, because much of what happens in this world is run by money. Bills are paid, incentive is given (gratuities and bonuses), food is purchased and services are hired.

few of my concerns. Furthermore, there were many questions about the locations for programs and available venues. For months, nothing was attempted, and, frankly, I hoped those on the youth choir committee who were encouraging these possibilities would change their mind. Thankfully, they did not. It would have been a colossal mistake, even a sin, since God was behind this movement. He was already preparing the way! Prayer, faith and submission were what God was asking. Surprisingly, it all started with a Facebook post from a poor, little village in Serbia, near the Hungarian border, where my dad was raised.

The post included a picture of a number of my cousins in front of the old farmhouse with the comment "getting together just like when Uncle Ivan would come." You see, my dad went to Serbia for nearly 30 years in a row to visit family, who were raised with a knowledge of the Nazareans, but then were influenced by Communism and are now secular in their beliefs, not unlike the vast majority in Europe. This post convinced me that a Christians' presence is not forgotten, and we should go.

Even though it started with a poor village, God took us to not one, but two palaces in Serbia! At the White Palace, the choir participated in a national event called "The Best Student Reception", where the Prince acknowledged and awarded the top 600 students, one from each high school, with a certificate, gift and opportunity for scholarships. These students,

The event was covered by TV news and the newspaper. At the Royal Palace, the choir was welcomed and personally thanked by Prince Alexander and Princess Katherine. During the reception that followed, various personal conversations with the Prince and Princess provided even more blessings to the choir and opened other doors through which our mission fields in Ghana, Papua New Guinea and Zambia will be blessed! The choir also had the privilege of singing in venues in Belgrade, Pancevo and Novi Sad, with the blessing of God's presence in each event.

In Hungary, we had a program in Budapest and Szeged, with many more blessings and expressions of thanksgiving from all the attendees. We sang in three churches in Germany and one in Salzburg, Austria. In each country we had several opportunities to sing in public squares, streets and cathedrals. We also had our first program in Richmond Hill, Canada, which also graciously hosted us for three days and nights of practice and devotions.

We thank all the churches and overseas co-planners, the ACCF Trustees and the many financial and prayer supporters for their participation. Each participant should be rejoicing in their role because *all of it* made a difference for God's eternal Kingdom!
