Ghana

(Africa)

Tressa and I were thrilled to be able to travel to Ghana in August with Bro. Judah Weinhardt and Bro. Wesley Jivan. It was Wesley and Judah's first time in Africa, and both of them adjusted well to the culture. We traveled to see many churches that were under construction and/or had significant needs for updating or repair. Faith Evangelical Church (FEC) continues to plant churches in outlying regions. Often these churches start with just a few members, a roof held up by posts, and a pastor committed to leading the church and helping it grow. Many of the churches tend to outgrow their buildings, which is a sign that it is time to plant a church elsewhere.

We also were able to visit the FEC school and the clinic. The school is in need of some serious upgrades to its library and classrooms. Because of generous donations over the past four months, we were able to send money to bolster library resources, to provide laboratory materials for a science classroom, and to renovate the main bathroom in the school.

The clinic still remains underfunded because of government delays in insurance reimbursement, which continues to hinder the day to day working of the hospital, especially with regards to the purchasing of drugs or needed equipment. Despite this, the clinic has started a dental outreach program with a mobile lab that goes out into the community. This mobile lab provides free dental care, and is also accompanied by members of the church who travel along to evangelize and invite people to church. Also, an exciting development on the horizon has been the FEC mission's involvement with Project Cure, a U.S. based charity organization that donates medical supplies and equipment to needy hospitals (more on page 5). Last week representatives from Project Cure visited the mission clinic to do a needs assessment to see firsthand which

supplies and equipment would be most helpful to the medical work there. Doctors, nurses and staff were interviewed, as well as a tour and examination of the facilities. In a few weeks, a process will be initiated that will create an invoice to fill a shipping container with needed supplies. At that time, the Foundation will send funds to Project Cure to deliver the container. Lord willing the clinic will receive vitally needed supplies and equipment shipped directly to their door within the next six months! We are very excited about how much this could potentially assist the clinic in meeting the needs of the community moving forward.

From Faith Evangelical Missions Worldwide (FEMW): The Lord has been gracious to us and we are very appreciative of what He is doing in our midst. We also thank Him for what He is doing through you. We give Him glory.

By the grace of God, the Mission in Ghana received donations in the last several months. They were used for the Clinic, Mamponse Church repairs, support for church pastors and elders, the purchase of Bibles, repair of the school restrooms and for meeting some of the outstanding bills of the August Missionary visit. We are grateful to God for the support and may God bless us all.

ACCN VISIT: A team of four (4) Missionaries from the ACCN, USA, made a ten days visit to Ghana in August 2019. The visiting team included Bro. John Schlaeffli (leader), Sis. Tressa Schlaeffli (both from Portland) Bro. Judah Weinhardt and Bro. Wesley Jivan (both from Ohio). They visited and had church services with the following churches at which they preached: La Wireless Church, Accra Central Church, Cape Coast Church, Lashiebi Church, Manponse Church, Akokoaso Church, Juapong Church. They also visited the following churches but could not have services at any of them: La Shepherd Church, Awoshie Church, Tema Church, Saaman Church, Odorkor Church, Osu Doku Church, Osu church and Fojoku Church. The visit was a huge success. The biblical teachings were spot on and the members were positively impacted. There were also interactions with the Mission's leadership which presented healthy learning opportunities.

- 1. WOMEN'S MINISTRY: There was a three day Women's Fellowship convention in August 2019. The theme for the convention was "Woman Break Forth into Fruitfulness" Isaiah 54:1. Attendance was great and all the speakers were members of the Women's Fellowship. The teachings were of great impact on the participants.
- 2. SAAMAN CHURCH: The building project is on-going.



3. NEWSLETTER: By the grace of God, the Mission published the first issue of a newsletter called "Voice of Faith" in September. The quarterly newsletter is to carry reports about the latest activities within the Mission and it is also aimed at having an educational impact on readers. The first issue has twelve pages and was positively accepted by the members. It contained a message from the Head of the Mission, highlights on the 2019 Easter Camp Meeting, a Youth corner, a business corner, the 2019 graduation ceremony of the Mission School and a sermon for the publication. May the name of the Lord be praised.



- 4. BOSO CHURCH: A new FEMW church has been established at Boso in the Eastern Region by a group of three Missionaries who visited the town in August 2019. During the 3 days visit, fifteen new souls accepted the Lord and they became the foundation members of the new Church. Brother Daniel Acquah is the Head Pastor and he led the baptism of the new souls. We are grateful unto the Lord for His grace and mercies.
- 5. AKOKOASO CHURCH: A group of three Missionaries visited the Akokoaso Church for 5 days in September 2019. The group were led by the Lord to have services and dawn broadcasts at Akokoaso and 26 souls were won to the Lord by His grace. They were baptized by Brother Daniel Acquah.
- 6. FEMW SPORTS CLUB: A sports club was inaugurated in late September at the Faith Cathedral at Mataheko. The club is for members of the FEMW churches in Accra. The disciplines introduced included football, volley ball, table tennis, basketball, and lime and spoon race. The indoor games included ludo, Scrabble, draughts and some local games. The club is for the provision of sports and relaxation facilities for Church members in a Christian atmosphere and to encourage members to take better care of their health. The inauguration afforded members an opportunity to fellowship in the Lord and have health enhancing exercises.

- 7. HOSPITAL: The hospital has been able to change the old dental chair, which was breaking down often, for a new one. The new dental chair was performing well at the time of this report. Two workshops were organized for the clinical staff of the hospital during the reporting period. The first one was a two days workshop on "Neonatal Resuscitation" and the speaker was Dr. Rachel Tei, a medical specialist of the Hospital. The second workshop was for one day on the topic "Cross Infection Control". The speaker was from Zoomlion Ltd., a health sanitation company. The Lord has been gracious to the hospital in many ways. Glory be to His name.
- SCHOOL COMPLEX: The school, which had been on vacation, re-opened in the middle of September 2019. The term of the old Board of Directors expired in August 2019 and a new Board has been formed to the glory of the Lord.
- 9. YOUTH RALLY: There was a one day Youth Rally held at the Faith Cathedral for the youth of the Mission. The Rally was well attended with participants coming from all Churches of the Mission. The theme was "Looking unto Jesus", and there were two presentations on entrepreneurship by some members of the Mission. There was a key note address by Brother Frederick France. The commitment showed by the youth was overwhelming. We are grateful to the Lord.
- 10.FEMW WORCESTER, MASSACHUSETTS: The FEMW Church at Worcester, Massachusetts, undertook a rebranding



exercise in September, 2019. The Church has adopted a new name: "The International Worshipper's World Prayer Centre" and has a new logo. The change in identity is to draw greater attention to the Church, and serve as an opportunity to enhance communication and to relate to people from every nation- not to be seen as an only Ghanaian Church. We are continuing to pray for this Church.

We continue to remember you in our prayers and request that you also remember us in your prayers. May God bless you and be your never ending help and support in the work you are doing in the vineyard.

Once again, this past Christmas, we were able to have a celebration for the kids. We had loads of food, fun, and best of all-fireworks! It was absolutely priceless to see how the kids responded to them. We had some kids who ran for their lives, some who were jumping up and down

Children are missing the chance to get an education and live a full life due to illnesses that would be treatable if they had access to proper health services. Delivering Medical Supplies & Equipment

Project C.U.R.E.'s Cargo program delivers 40-foot semi-trailer-sized cargo containers carrying medical donations to under-resourced hospitals, clinics and community health centers in developing countries. Project C.U.R.E. collaborates with community partners in each country to develop a high-level understanding of the scope of need. Our thorough, on-site assessment process ensures that every

container delivered will meet the specific needs of the recipient hospital or clinic, equipping the medical staff with life-saving tools to improve diagnosis, treatment and care. On average, each 40' container places \$400,000 worth of basic medical supplies and technologically-appropriate equipment directly into the hands of medical providers, where it is needed most.

From the Missionary Committee Chairman:

We are frequently looking for opportunities to utilize other sources to further our missions without the Foundation covering the entire cost. We have begun the initial discussions and assessments with Project Cure to contribute medical supplies to the Clinic in Ghana. For a relatively small investment on our end, the clinic can receive newer medical equipment and supplies, which are very much needed. STAFF CHANGES: On November 11th, we welcomed **Danielly** as part of the CLM team. She had time to learn Raquel's job (administrative assistant) before Raquel ended her time at CLM in December. At the beginning of January, **Tiene**, our new social worker joined us, taking the place of Luciana who had left in December as well. May God continue to give these two ladies wisdom as they begin their ministry at CLM.

NEW KIDS: On November 7, we received **Abymael**, 2 days old, along with his mother. They will both be with us for a time while their case is being decided. Please pray for the Lord to work out the

On January 24th, we received 3 brothers, **Lucas** (9), **João** (5), and **Kauan** (3). We are thankful to receive younger kids for a change, making it much easier to teach and bring about changes in their lives. They are adapting very well. They are polite, communicative, and well behaved. Pray for them and the future the Lord has planned for them.

CHRISTMAS AND OTHER VISITORS: Christmas is always an exciting time of the year. The week before Christmas, we had our secret friend gift exchange, received our new CLM t-shirts, and received an all-you-can-eat pizza dinner for the whole CLM Family from the owners of a local pizza place. On Christmas Eve, we followed the Brazilian tradition of having a late night dinner with all the houses participating together. On Christmas Day, we had the traditional Frosted Flakes breakfast, followed by opening presents sent by people in São Paulo, lunch and swimming.

Dr. Chuck Misja visited us at Christmas time again this year. The leadership looks forward to his input and his help in reflecting on how well we achieved our goals during the year 2019 and evaluation

of what the focus needs to be for the year 2020. May God bless him for the sacrifice he

makes to come every year.

We have long been aware of the deep spiritual and emotional needs of the CLM children, and at times God has sent us people to help with this specific area. On the weekend of January 18-19, we received a visit from Antonia, a very special servant of God who has a ministry in the area of healing the wounded spirit and freedom from spiritual bondage. She worked with the caregivers all day Saturday and had individual meetings with staff members that evening and Sunday morning. It was a very blessed time for all, and she already has plans to return to continue the work she started.

DIFFICULT GOODBYES: On January 24^{th} , Gilmar (9) and Charles (5) returned to their family. This was a court decision that was made due to repeated appeals by their father for their guardianship. We are concerned about their well-being, as all 9 children of these parents (and 2 grandchildren) have spent time at CLM and the government group homes due to a very complicated home situation. Please pray fervently for their protection and for God's will to be done in their lives

NEW VEHICLES: At the end of December, CLM was able to buy an extended cab pickup truck with funds received from the Upper Marlboro church. It is a blessing to have a truck that can haul items, when necessary. We also received a Ford Ka (sedan) from the state which is very good for longer distances.



We are awaiting one more vehicle from a grant that was approved. It is a blessing to have reliable cars for our continual transportation needs.

We have seen God's provision in many ways throughout the past year and are extremely grateful to Him and to all of you who have

been used to meet CLM's needs. Please continue to support this ministry in prayer and financially as the Lord leads.

This is the second year that Debbie and her part of the Freeman family have invited the neighbors of Oak Street to "Christmas on the porch". Having gone through some periods of violence in the


not too distant past, many on the block are hesitant to step out. Last year many were peaking around their curtains. This year a warm


solid foundation where growth can take place.





Legacy Bible Institute: DAP has partnered with Upward Bound Youth (UBY) for nearly nine years now to make Legacy Bible Institute a place of immersive biblical learning, deep spiritual transformation, and hands-on ministry training. At Legacy, we deeply desire to see every believer grow into the full stature of Christ and be fully equipped for God's mission in their local neighborhoods and home churches. In the same way the disciples of Jesus were forever changed by dropping everything to learn as much as they could from him, followers of Jesus today will be deeply blessed by joining an intentional learning community that is centered around Christ and committed to the full-time study and practice of God's Word. Young believers are facing an increasingly complex and challenging mission field around them. By deepening their spiritual roots at Legacy, they can be better prepared for whatever vocation or calling that God has ahead of them.

Since Legacy's inception in 2011, 61 people have enrolled as fulltime residential students, and 13 ACC congregations have had the opportunity to see the positive impact that Legacy can have on their young people.
