in September. September came and went and the schools remain closed. It is now looking like in-person learning will only return at the beginning of next year. The boys continue to study every day and do their online classes with Heltton's help. They are learning, but it is not the same, and even

they admit that they miss going to school.

The boys have also not been to church since the start of the pandemic. However, we continue to do both morning and evening devotions with them every day. One benefit to being quarantined is that we are able to spend even more time with them, studying God's Word and drawing closer to one another. The boys are

currently participating in a Bible contest about the book of Daniel, which they are very excited about. It is gratifying to see their knowledge of the Bible. We pray that these seeds will continue to take root in their hearts, and they will surrender to the Lord's working in their lives.

The boys remain without visitors as well. Seven months without anyone being allowed into the home has been challenging for the boys. Thankfully, our staff has been good



about taking the boys on outings to the local climbing rocks, soccer field, etc., just so they can get out of this environment.

We recently said goodbye to João Lincon, a worker who devoted almost his whole life

to this ministry. João Lincon was raised here, came back to work as a counselor when he was a young adult, and then worked as the gardener and maintenance man for the past 30+ years. João had been temporarily suspended from all duties during the past few months since he is in the "at risk" group; however, he has now decided to officially retire. João leaves behind a great legacy here at the home and we are grateful for his many years of service to God, in this ministry.

The holiday season is fast approaching and Christmas will be here soon. With that in mind, we would like to encourage you to send Christmas cards to our boys. They so look forward to this tradition every year, and it

family, the church family, and how to keep sharing, caring and spreading God's word.

MISSION

Our emphasis this year was on our spiritual identity.



Each week, we studied who we are in Christ according to the scriptures: a child of God, a new

creature, loved, chosen, justified and righteous, a minister of God, free from condemnation, a conqueror, etc.

For a while, it became difficult when we all became quarantined, but we grabbed what was available through social media, zoom, and online streaming to continue pouring Biblical truths into everyone interested. Through these isolated times, we grew in faith and strength. Our zoom groups and small groups were stronger and waiting for restrictions to be lifted.

Some of our families who have kids and teens live on the other side of town. After prayer and some quick decisions, we started four small groups in "grandma's" house. All of a sudden, we had a group of kids under six, a boy's group, a teen girl's group and a group of adults. Now we are wondering about church planting there.

 We are in contact with many new people all of the time and especially during these different kinds of days.
- There is still construction to finish for our children's classrooms. We trust God's timing is perfect timing.

School of Life:

If we look back through this year, maybe we could find a lot of reasons to be disappointed, but somehow God always has a way to surprise us with his faithfulness and



goodness. As the coordinator of the social project, "Escuela de Vida", I was very sad that we had to cancel the classes, and for a moment I thought there was no way for us to keep ministering to kids during this time. But instead of giving up, we decided to take a new direction and act in faith. That's when we started the kids' life groups, where we divided our kids in small groups of 10 kids and met with them once a

week, to speak life to them, give them a chance to have fun, but also take time to worship and minister to them. Today, we have 49 kids faithfully participating in the life groups and we have seen how God is still working in their hearts. They are sure of who they are in Christ and they know that even when they face hard times like this, they have a good Father that

never leaves them. Our goal is to have a family event by the

end of November in each lifegroup, inviting the parents to come and participate in one meeting so they can also have the chance to hear the Word of God and be saved.



Lifegroups are also our strength with youth groups. For almost 5

months, we could only come together with 20 people per service, and the way we could continue to be connected with everyone was by meeting in our small groups once a week. Now that we can finally meet with over 50 people, we celebrate the fact that we stayed strong as a group, even if we couldn't meet all at once. Meeting in small groups is not a new thing. We see in the Bible that the Church of Acts also met house to house and that's how they grew as a Christian family. The work of God will not be limited by the struggles we are facing, but we will come out of this crisis stronger and more fruitful as a Church.





Greetings from GREEN OLIVE TREE MINISTRIES

The foretold transition has happened. Brent and Debbie have fully moved from day-to-day directors and staff of the ministries in Gravata, Pernambuco, Brazil, to virtual counselors based in Johnstown, Pennsylvania.

Brent arrived to the Freemans' new home state of Pennsylvania on September 24, met at the airport by the joyful family members already residing in PA - Debbie, Elizabeth, Karah, Larissa and Kauan. The past five weeks have been full of reconstructing life for Brent on US ground; establishing residency and learning to say "dollars" instead of "Reais", answering strangers in English instead of Portuguese, and for the first time in married life asking Debbie if he can use the bank card and car! Debbie is learning to say, "we need to ask your Dad first", and has moved from the head of the eating table to the side.

Meanwhile in Brazil, the leadership team is learning the intimate ropes of dealing with the day-to-day issues of caring for extra family members while continuing with the responsibilities of their own family living, work and ministry. Our sons, of

along with course, are experimenting with trying out new, independent wings- some trials successful and some disappointing, but hopefully all leading to growth and increased maturity. Bia, our daughter with special needs, is having some struggles

with her new environment. Consistency and time should bring peace, eventually. We appreciate your prayers for each of our leftbehind sons and daughter and their care givers.

Dido and Sara have taken responsibility for the hands-on care of our family, as well as their labors with the maintenance of the property. They expressed a bit of anxiety in the first weeks of doing it alone, but seem to be adjusting now. They are busy feeding and working alongside our family members, keeping up with dentist and doctor appointments, and overseeing daily medications. They ask prayer for the strength and wisdom to

do these tasks.

Daniel, the new director and president of the mission, and Evaneides, his wife, have announced that Eliza will be a big sister in April. They are feeling a bit hampered by the discomforts associated with the beginning stages of a forming new life. They have not yet moved to the mission property, but Daniel commutes there daily. He assures us that the Lord is caring for all.

We have two other expectant mothers in our church group. A new wave is beginning at GOTM!

The team has also learned of, and been in contact with, a mother on drugs, who is not able to care for her four month old infant. Her three other children have already been taken from the home. Prayer is requested for the God-led response to this need. It would seem that the Lord is reminding GOTM of its root ministry, and that the need continues. He has provided a new set of younger blood to again respond.

Because of the intensity of the adjustments to Brent's leaving, the October and November outreach events on the GOTM calendar were cancelled. The next scheduled outreach event will be the Community Christmas Celebration, held every December to help our unchurched neighbors understand what the birth of Jesus has to do with their lives today.

Here in Pennsylvania we are heading into the darker days of winter rain and snow, while in Brazil the rainy season has ended and the sun will intensely shine spreading its heat almost everyday. There are many contrasts between these two dwelling places, but the constant factor is the

sovereignty of God in each of our lives, and His unending love and faithfulness to those who are His. As we seek Him, and only Him, for our moments and days and years, we can always rest assured that no matter what our present daily circumstances look like, the purposes of our Lord are being worked out according to His sovereign plan. May we have eyes to see beyond this moment.

How to Create an Account

- 1. Send us an email with your name, address, phone number and birth date, requesting an account.

- 3. Click the link in the invitation you receive to create a Realm password.
- 4. You will then receive a verification email with a link that you need to click on to verify your account.
- 5. Confirm your birth date or phone number on the web page that opens from that link.

You can access your account from your computer or mobile device using the following web browsers: Chrome, Firefox, Microsoft Edge or Safari. There is also another way to access your account, and that is by using the *Realm Connect App*, available on iPhone and Android. pregnancies are on the rise, and more and more children are


living on the streets.

She did move into her own apartment in Guarapuava and soon found a job with our help. In October, the judge determined she could have her two older daughters back, as well! There was great rejoicing

at CLM when we heard the news! The family is reunited and doing well. Mirian has expressed much gratefulness for all the help she received here at CLM.



Patricia also left CLM in August, two months before her 19th birthday. She

went to live with her parents and at first, was not doing well. After about two months, she requested that we help her find a job. We were able to help her find a youth apprenticeship position at a factory. She works on the production line and is enjoying it so far.

The three brothers (Lucas, Joao, Kauan), who were having visits for a possible adoption, went to live with their new parents at the beginning of August, too. We recently visited

> them, and they are adapting well to their new family.

New Kids

In August, Wesllen (13) arrived. He had been with a foster family in Guarapuava and has shown some difficulty getting used to the limits at CLM.

Please pray for his continued adaptation and healing of his traumas. He is having visits

with his mother for a possible return.

In September, we welcomed Miguel (10) and Mateus (7). They had been living with adoptive parents for almost 4 years, but the family decided not to keep them. This is an incredibly sad event and leaves them with one more

trauma to overcome. Pray that God will give us wisdom to work in their lives and provide another adoptive family for them.

Pray for More Caregivers


In March 2020, Fernando and Monica came to CLM as caregivers. They worked until August 2020, when they decided (along with the board), that CLM was not a good fit for them.

Evanildo and Eliana worked at CLM for a year and a half. During this period, we had several problems with them, both in character and difficulty in fulfilling work obligations. Several times we were close to dismissing them; however, because we understand that we are a ministry, we kept deciding to give them one more chance. In September, the situation became unsustainable, and we had to ask them to leave.

With the two couples leaving, we've tried a few different strategies to cover days off. Wal is currently covering them, instead of working full-time with the childrens' schooling. We are actively searching for dedicated, Godly couples that can commit their time to caring for vulnerable children. Please pray that God will bring us the right people, in His perfect timing.

The CLM youth, ages 14 and up, have just started going to church again on Sundays, and we are waiting to see how that goes before sending the younger kids. Meanwhile, Pastor Rogerio is coming to CLM on Wednesday nights to hold services for the CLM family.

Solar Energy at Work

The solar energy project is complete, and the electric bill dropped 90% in the first month it was in operation! We're looking forward to seeing more great savings in the future.
