Greetings from Lebenshaus/GOTM

The GOTM team has come to the difficult decision that it is time to downsize. During its history, Lebenshaus (House of Life) Farm has served well the purposes for which the Lord granted the acquisition of this buried treasure. It has been home for dozens of children over the years. Scores of students and their parents from the former GOTM School in Pombos, as well as local families, have enjoyed camps and retreats in its refreshing natural beauty. Lebenshaus has served as a teaching center- training teachers, students and believers. The facilities also provided opportunities for acquiring diverse skills including horsemanship, woodworking, gardening and landscaping, sheep raising, construction and building maintenance, cooking and baking.

Now, almost 16 years after its purchase, the care needs of the present home of GOTM exceed the physical abilities of our smaller staff. We are asking Our Provider to bring a buyer willing to purchase this land for the real value it has accrued. With the proceeds of the sale, we plan to buy a more manageable property, closer to the town of Gravata, with facilities appropriate to the present needs and Ministries of GOTM. These Ministries include:

- * A home for the continuing care of Special Needs family members:
Our son Edson and his wife Milka have assumed the role of principle caregivers and overseers for their daily living and work responsibilities.
- * A meeting place for continuing Bible Studies, discipleship and Worship services.
- * A center for educational support for children of mission families and interested neighbors.

Green Olive Tree Ministries has always sought to be a bright beacon of truth where Jesus is supreme and God's Word is loved and, by His grace, faithfully and clearly taught and practiced. The Lord has given us a dear Brother who is an able and committed teacher — Daniel Salgado (wife Evaneides and two daughters, Eliza and Liz)

Dear Friends,

We are so excited to share that our after school program has started again after almost a two year hiatus due to Covid restrictions. We began at the beginning of March with 9 boys in the afternoon. (School in Brazil is only half-day, either morning or afternoon.) We had so much interest from children in the town wanting to participate (who study in the afternoon) that we also started a morning group with 8 boys participating. We now have around 30 children participating in the program, which runs from Monday to Thursday. The after school program, known as CTE Adonai in Portuguese, includes times of music, devotions, prayer, skits, tutoring, games, and snacks. We also are offering several workshops including cooking, guitar, and soccer. Hopefully, we can start a computer skills and English class soon.

We are actively seeking volunteers to help teach in our program, specifically for the English class. An invitation is extended to anyone who would be interested in coming as a short-term missionary to help teach English as part of our program. In the past, we have welcomed several short-term missionaries from Canada, South Africa, Switzerland, Poland,

and France through Operation Mobilization Brazil. These missionaries each stayed for about a month and during their time, despite the language barrier, they were able to teach English, play with the children during free-time, and do special activities- all while showing them God's love through their daily interactions. We would like to encourage anyone who might be interested in coming to pray for the Lord's leading, and please feel free to contact us with any questions or more details about an opportunity to join us here at the Nepo Children's Home.

Thankfully, we were blessed with beautiful weather on the day of the event. The participants donated over 450 kilos of basic food supplies, including rice, sugar, and beans to our home and we praise God for this huge blessing. Our boys enjoyed helping

In February, we received a new boy, Ytalo, 12. He enjoys soccer, playing video games, and fishing, but does not like to study or go to school. Ytalo communicates well about day-to-day matters, but says little about his life before coming here with his family and

his experiences. He is still adapting to life here at the home and we ask that you keep him in prayer.

Our cook and household helper, Vera, who has been with us for three years, had to leave her position due to health and

Due to Carlos' departure, we had to once again look for a caretaker couple. We praise the Lord for quickly providing a new couple. Demerval and Paula have been hired for a three month trial period. He is a karate instructor and she works during the day at a local private school. We are thankful for the help he provides during the day here at the home with the after school program, and that they can both work the rotating evening shift with the boys.

In closing, we would like to sincerely thank you for your faithful financial contributions which help us in the daily care of the children the Lord has entrusted to us. We also are so grateful for your continued prayer support. We praise God for your partnership in this ministry!

The Project “Escuela de Vida” is back! There aren’t enough words to express the excitement and happiness that filled our hearts when we saw all the children reunited for the first day of

classes after two years.

But, before we started with the classes we had a full month of training with the volunteers in February. It was an incredible time where we prayed together, heard words of encouragement, received instructions about how classes were going to be and we were also able to grow in unity as a group. The volunteer team of 2022 consists of 27 people, the biggest one we've had so far. God is good!

The volunteers are youth, adults and older ladies from our church that donate their time to serve, teach and love

the kids. They’re divided in groups and each one of them have a responsibility to fulfill. Our curriculum offers classes in Christian History, Literature, Physical



Education, English and Principles & Values. We also offer a delicious snack prepared by the hands of the best ladies.



March was a great month! The Escuela de Vida Project started and each day has been better than we ever expected. We have a total of 63 children participating with

us, divided by ages in three classes. Each class has a tutor, three helpers and



also a name that identifies the group. The first class is called “VALIENTES”

(Braves) and children from 5 to 7 years old are part of it. The second one is called



“ESCOGIDOS” (The Chosen) and children 8 and 9 years old are in it. The oldest class, that has the group from 10 to 12 years old, is called “TIMOTEOS” (Timothys).

This year, in our Bible class, we are studying the book of Proverbs. The classes are always based on a special “Vocabulary of the day”, and, based on a specific word, the teachers develop their teaching. Words are the building blocks of ideas; man cannot think without words. As Christians, we need a noble and Biblical vocabulary to guide our reasoning and decision-making.

Jesus said, “My words are spirit” (John 6:63). Words have the power to create and destroy (Proverbs 18:21). Through the study of God's Word, a child's vocabulary is greatly improved when the teachers mediate between the language and begin to use words to create new realities.

In each class, the students learn new vocabulary words from the book of Proverbs. These key words are used by putting each flashcard that we have printed for each lesson on the wall in the classroom. The words stays on the wall during the entire week and the children have the opportunity to look at it many times to always remember what they have learned.

The following week, as the teachers introduce a new word, they replace the old one with the flashcards from the next lesson, and put them in a “treasure chest.” Each teacher uses these



words throughout the week when they talk to the children, helping them to develop their thinking and reasoning skills by asking them to include the words

in their conversation and when answering questions.

Words are the keys to unlock the treasure chest of ideas. Good words are worth a lot and cost little. We believe that by teaching the children a whole new vocabulary that is based on God’s Word, they will be able to develop lifelong habits of personal study and reflection of principles,

building Christian consecrated minds for fresh insight and Biblical reasoning. "The fear of the LORD is the beginning



of wisdom: And the knowledge of the holy is understanding." (Proverbs 9:10)

We are thankful for an upcoming 9th year anniversary at church! For 5 years we held church in our garage and for four years we have been in our building structure while it was being

built. Every day it looks more beautiful and we are thankful for all of you who have donated towards this building, and especially during the pandemic! God is good! He is faithful. We keep praying and believing and He keeps things moving.

Our mission statement says that we are growing up a church where everyone is a minister (an ambassador, a messenger, a witness) and every home is an extension of the

Last year we opened a new outreach in Capiatá. This family of believers lived through an amazing transformation. They were

facing separation, addictions and domestic violence. When God worked miracles in their lives, they became saved, and never stop telling other of their transformation. We will be officially starting church services there in June.

This year, Christian and Carolina offered to open their home up to a new outreach, and since March, we have been visiting a growing group of believers in Ypané. There is a children's group, a teen group, and an adult group. They are praying about a gym that is near their house which could possibly be used for social gatherings... like church??? Help us in prayer for these two outreaches.

We are blessed with a Spiritual Maturity Bible Study course which is helping our Church grow in wisdom and knowledge of Biblical principles and conduct. It has been so encouraging to see individual growth. One sister told us that her daughter said, "Mommy, you've changed so much! You react so differently, what happened?" She told her daughter (who had stopped going to church) about the Spiritual Maturity course and now the daughter is coming. Pastors Gabriel and Oscar are also offering SEMINARY classes, there are about 30 young kids and adults digging deeper into God's Word and understanding Biblical doctrines.

Escuela de Vida also keeps us all busy, as most of us are volunteers, teaching or serving this next generation for Christ.

We still have some needs for air conditioning in the classrooms and in our church, and tile floor for church, but just as God has provided all of our needs in so many ways, we know that in His timing, He will provide. Phase by phase we see that His hand of blessing has been over our heads, our ministries and our family. Thanks for your prayers, encouragement and financial blessings.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Thank you so much for faithfully lifting up this ministry in prayer. The last few months have been very intense, with many changes and many of our teens needing specialized attention. Here's a look at what's been going on at CLM since the last issue:

Staff Changes

During the past few months, we had two couples leave CLM. Caregivers, Hoelynton & Ana and Darcy & Luciana, believed God directed them that their time in this position had come to an end.

We were thankful that God quickly brought us new couples to replace them. Rogerio and Bianca, and their son Jose (4), arrived at the end of March from São Paulo. They'd had some training on working with vulnerable children but are now adapting to ministering in this context in everyday life.

Cristiano and Thais, and their sons Guilherme and Edevilson (both 17), moved back to CLM in April. This couple had served at CLM for nearly 5 years before leaving in 2021, after adopting Edevilson, and it's great to have them back!

CLM teens Lydia* (16) and Ingrid* (14) were baptized on March 20, along with 3 of Rogerio and Vivien's children: Zachary, Hannah, and Asaph. Please pray for all these young people, that they would continue seeking God with all of their hearts.

Teens in Specialized Treatment Facilities

In the past few months, we've had 3 different teens in specialized treatment facilities. Jude* was in drug rehab from February to April. When he was released, he was already 18 years old and went to live with his family. He was at CLM for a very short time, but we believe that God can bring growth to the seeds planted in his heart.

Jennifer* (17) was in a psychiatric hospital from the end of February through the end of April after suffering from deep depression after losing her rights to her daughter Alyssa*. Please pray for her as she readjusts to life at CLM, and pray for her future, as she is quite behind in school.

At the end of April, Iris* (13) was also admitted to a psychiatric hospital after suffering several bouts of running away, with self-mutilation and aggressive behavior toward those trying to help her. She needs much prayer for a complete transformation and healing of her heart and mind.

High Turnover in Children and Teens

5 children arrived and 5 left in the last 3 months. Two of them stayed only about a month. Please pray for grace and wisdom for the CLM team, so that we can effectively minister to each child or teen, no matter how long they are with us.

Volunteers from the Community

We are thankful for the volunteer teachers that are coming each weekend to tutor the CLM kids in Math and Portuguese. It is turning out to be a good experience for everyone.

Easter Activity

On the evening of Good Friday, we were able to organize a Passover seder for the CLM team. A few couples and youth from a local church were able to stay with the children while

the team had this special time together.

The evening started in the chapel area, where there was a



table spread with foods that Jesus might have eaten with his disciples at the Last Supper. We had bread, fish, lamb, bitter herbs, grapes, and grape juice, reminding us of the life of our Savior and His death as our Passover lamb. After the meal, we had communion in the woods by the stream. It was a wonderful time of renewal for all who participated.

We covet your fervent prayers for our team as we continue to receive many teens who need a lot of individualized attention and often don't want to be here. Pray for grace for each team member as we seek to minister in all the details and particularities of each situation.

meets, and we will be sad to see him go when he returns home. Then, on April 28, Thomas and Ashley Nitz arrived for a 3 week stay. While visiting, Thomas is helping Adrian Acs with the many ongoing construction projects happening around the

school. Ashley brought camera equipment and is capturing photos and videos of each aspect of the ministry for media purposes, as well as updating needed sponsorship photos. As part of that, she is training a few Zambians on how to take photos for the ministry so we can continually have updated pictures of what is happening in Zambia. Meanwhile, Bob Ritzmann, who sits on the Lifesong board, will be viewing the progress that Lifesong Zambia has experienced since his last

visit in 2018.

School has been closed for the last two weeks, and will be reopening on May 9th for a new term. This break allows



the students to spend time with friends and family at home, and gives the teachers time to prepare for the upcoming term.

The Foundation uses a record keeping solution called Realm. Unlike social media or our website, Realm is a closed software package relevant to your participation with the Foundation. Everyone gets a unique profile. Your profile enables you to be a part of a group, track your giving, add one-time and recurring donations, update your contact information, change family details, set notification preferences, or even add a profile picture. By keeping this information current, you are ensuring that you will receive mailings to the correct address, as well as helping the Foundation keep costs down.

How to Create an Account

1. Send us an email with your name, address, phone number and birthdate, requesting an account.
2. Watch for your emailed invitation to join Realm.
3. Click the link in the invitation you receive to create a Realm password.
4. You will then receive a verification email in which you need to click a link to verify your account.
5. Confirm your birthdate or phone number on the webpage that opens from that link.

You can then sign into Realm at <https://onrealm.org/accfoundation>. Enter your email address (the one at which you received the invitation) and the password you created. You can access your account from your computer or mobile device using the following web browsers: Chrome, Firefox, Microsoft Edge or Safari. There is also another way to access your account, and that is by using the [Realm Connect App](#), available for iPhone and Android.

UKRAINE UPDATE

The ACCF, via the Eastern European Relief Committee (EERC), has sent funds for support into Ukraine, and up to the time of this writing, they are still able to receive and utilize the funds we are able to get into the country. We know that money is of limited value if you cannot spend it (a bag of gold is worthless if it won't buy a loaf of bread), but to this point, this is still the most efficient, effective and immediate physical help we can give our Brethren in Ukraine.

We are continuing to watch this all unfold, understanding that when the conflict ends, there may be greater financial and material needs which we would like to be in a position to address, if the Lord so allows. With the help of our Brethren in neighboring countries, our focus continues to be those who remain in Ukraine.

As always, though, our Brethren need our prayers. We must pray not only for their safety, but that God's Children represent their Father well during times of potential fear, imminent danger and possible overwhelming loss. This is an opportunity for Believers to demonstrate that they truly are different because of what they believe and in Whom they believe.

This is also an opportunity for us in North America to attest

to the Lords's generosity to us and through us and to prove our faithfulness in financial and prayer support. Likewise, this gives us an illustrative witness to the world by loving and supporting our Brethren in Christ. Though most of us have never met them, still we love and support those of the household of faith.

The Ukrainian recipients have expressed a sincere, heartfelt thankfulness to all that have prayed and continue to pray for them and for the donated funds.

As local (domestic) ministries, several of our Church families have also embarked on the resettling of those who have immigrated to the United States. Cross- country flights have been purchased for entire families, houses and/or apartments furnished, and even vehicles have been provided to help ease the transition. Our West Akron Church has jumped in fully to assist immigrants in resettling- with furniture, household goods, employment and even homes.
